Mental health nurses work in hospitals and the community, to support people with mental health issues.

- Assessing and supporting patients.
- Encouraging patients to take part in role play, art, drama and discussion as therapies.
- Physical care, if the patient is too old or ill to look after themselves.

Paramedic



Paramedics provide first aid and life support treatment in emergency situations and transport sick and injured people who require skilled treatment.



4.43% rise in employment over the next 5 years.



Typically working 40 - 45 hours per week on shifts, including evenings, weekends and bank holidays.



- Briefs other medical staff when handing over the patient, and completes patient report forms describing the patient.
- Resuscitates and/or stabilises patient using relevant techniques, equipment and drugs.
- Assesses the nature of injuries, provides first aid treatment and ascertains appropriate method of conveying patient.

Midwife

 Midwives support pregnant women and their babies before, during and after, childbirth.

 3.36% rise in employment over the next 5 years.

 Typically working 40 - 45 hours per week on shifts, including evenings, weekends and bank holidays.

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- Explain options like giving birth in hospital or at home.
 - Run classes about pregnancy (antenatal) and parenting.
 - Check the health of mother and baby during pregnancy.
 - Check progress when labour starts.
 - Monitor the baby during labour.
 - Give pain relief or advise on ways to manage pain.
 - Deliver the baby.

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
