 Photographers take and process pictures of people, places, products and events. They also use various photoshop software packages to enhance the quality of pictures for clients.

TV/Film Producer or Director



Producers look after the business side of productions and directors lead the creative and technical production for cinema and television.



2.49% rise in employment over the next 5 years.



Typically working 39 - 41 irregular hours per week, including evenings, weekends away from home.



- Director - meeting producers to plan filming schedules and resources.
- Director - developing scripts or ideas for programmes.
- Director - developing storyboards.
- Producer - deciding which projects to produce, or creating programme ideas yourself.
- Reading scripts.
- Producer - securing the rights for books or screenplays, or negotiating with writers to produce new screenplays.
- Producer - planning filming schedules.
